



Collegedale Credit Union was founded in May 1952, launching modestly from a desk drawer in the basement of the Administration Building at Southern Missionary College (now Southern Adventist University). Several college employees played important roles in establishing the credit union. Among them was Charles “Chick” Fleming, then Business Manager at Southern Missionary College, who recognized the need for a local credit union and helped bring the vision to life. Dr. Wayne VandeVere, a longtime professor who dedicated 40 years to the college’s Business Department, also served as Chairman of the Collegedale Credit Union Board of Directors for nearly four decades.

Collegedale Credit Union is a state-chartered institution regulated and examined by both state and federal authorities. Under its original 1952 charter, granted by the State Banking Commission, membership was open to any member of the Seventh-day Adventist Church worldwide. In 1983–1984, the credit union expanded its charter to include multiple ZIP codes, as well as employees of Seventh-day Adventist institutions and organizations.
